Coaches will be sourced, vetted and employed by Sunderland Foundation of Light. The Foundation will provide a service of quality assurance and monitoring of coaches deployed. As advised by the government these coaches will work alongside teachers to provide professional development and will not cover PPA time. <p><b><u>Outdoor Adventurous PE (Years 2,3,4,5 &amp;6) Real Adventure Through Sport</u></b></p> <p>Offering pupils the opportunity to develop in a range of adventure sports with the additional elements of developing leadership and team work skills. <p><b><u>Forest School (Nursery / Reception / Year 1)</u></b></p> <p>Following the success of the Forest School programme during 2016-17. Reduced support will be available to further develop staff to gain the skills and knowledge to confidently provide an outdoor space in their own school grounds. By providing qualified teaching professionals who share their skills and experience this will empower staff and children to create their very own “classroom without walls”; this teaching model empowers the staff to develop a sustainable Forest School by modelling best practice and providing short and long term teaching resources linked to National Curriculum Themes. Through Forest School activities the strands of <b>physical development</b> particularly <b>moving and handling and health and self care</b> are being regularly promoted.
